11. Cub Scout Achievements
(reprint)

For those who are new to scouting, you may have observed some Cub Scouts wearing belts that feature some type of silver or gold emblem attached to the belt itself. That is the Belt Loop program, which is the reward for participating in the Cub Scouts Academics and Sports Program.

This optional program is one method of addressing the third aim of Scouting: the development of physical, mental and emotional fitness. Fitness includes the body (well-tuned and healthy), the mind (able to think and solve problems), and the emotions (self-control, courage, and self-respect). As in most activities in Cub Scouting, this is not meant to be a competitive program, instead, the boys are encouraged to DO THEIR BEST.

The Academic and Sports Program is an optional program for all Cub Scouts. It is not part of the normal requirements towards ranks, except where used in obtaining various Webelos activity badges and Wolf Elective 20 (Sports). Its purpose is to assist the Scouts in learning a new skill, or improving one they already possess.

A variety of recognition items are available for the boys (Tiger Cubs, Cub Scouts, or Webelos Scouts) who participate in the program.

Belt loops are awarded to boys who complete the three belt loop requirements in an academic subject or sport. Academic belt loops are gold, and Sports belt loops are silver (except for the Archery and BB-gun Shooting belt loops, which are brass colored) Shown below is a website where you can learn more about this optional program for sports or academics:

This is a self monitoring program; as you complete requirements for Belt Loops, please contact me and I will make arrangements to purchase the respective belt loops for your scout. We will purchase Belt Loops every 30-60 days.

1. District Chuckwagon Derby - Training in March TBA, Event on Saturday, April 8th, 2006, Camp Carpenter.

Read this month's "Cubmaster's Corner" for information about this event and sign-up tonight. This fun, challenging, district-wide competition takes place on Saturday, April 8th at Camp Carpenter. Training sessions will be scheduled during March.

The Chuckwagon Derby is a voluntary event for the scouts and requires a big commitment from them to: study and practice skills on their own, attend as many of the special prep sessions as possible (3 are planned) and, to show up on the day of the event, rested, ready and pumped up... rain, snow or shine!

2. Webelos Weekend, Friday, April 7th - Sunday, April 9th, 2006, Camp Carpenter, Pack sleepover scheduled for Saturday, April 8th only.

All Webelos and Bears are encouraged to attend Webelos Weekend at Camp Carpenter. This is an opportunity for the Webelos and Bears to get a taste of what Boy Scouts is all about. We will be pitching our own tents, building camp fires, planning a menu and cooking our own meal on Saturday night. Plan on "bag lunches" for the rest of your meals. The Scouts attending will also be able to take part in the Chuckwagon Derby. Sign up tonight and we'll keep you posted with the details, packing lists, etc.

3. April Pack Meeting, Pinewood Derby, Saturday April 15th, 2006, Memorial School, begins at 9am starting with the Tigers.

(Weigh-in date and time prior to April 15th TBA)

This fun event involves racing small, wooden scout-designed and decorated cars down a track in hopes of being crowned the next Pinewood Derby champ! Car kits were awarded at February's Pack Meeting or can be purchased for \$3.50 each. Scouts then take those kits home, put them together, modify their shape as desired using safe tool handling techniques, and then decorate as much as their imagination allow. Just a reminder, when crafting your car, use the District Derby rules that were provided on a separate paper, particularly the weight and dimension requirements. (The instructions with the kit are not correct.) Weigh-in date and location will be announced via email in the next few weeks. Also remember that once you drop your car off for weigh-in, it

will not be returned to you until after the competition(s).

4. Scout Night Sleepover with the Fisher Cats, Fisher Cats vs. Altoona Curve, June 10th, 2006, Fisher Cat Stadium

Pack 114 has 50 participants looking forward to the 2nd Annual Scout Sleepover Night at Fisher Cats Ballpark on Saturday, June 10, 2006. An additional 19 will attend the game only. Please remember that tents are ok but it has to be the type that simply sits on top of the grass and cannot require the use of any type of spikes in the ground.

5. Summer Camps, Sleepover Resident Camp, July 2006 or Week-long Day Camp, August 2006.

The Cub Scouts have two opportunities to put the "outing" in Scouting. Prices for all programs are very reasonable and all camps are fully certified and accredited by the State of New Hampshire and the National Camping Service of the Boy Scouts of America.

Great times can be had **July 23rd-July 27th, 2006** for Resident Camp. This 5-day, 4 night camping event has the theme "All Fun and Games" It is open to boys entering grades 2-5 in September 2006. Camp runs from Sunday afternoon to Thursday evening and Scouts will have the opportunity to use the frontier fort, a Native American village and Pirate's Cove areas. There will be swimming, sports, crafts, nature, archery range, boating, BB gun range, campfires and a family barbecue among other activities.

Another fantastic event is Day Camp; **August 7th-11th, 2006**. The theme for Day Camp is "Just Imagine" and this camp features water activities, the BB range, nature, crafts, sports, the archery range, scout skills and family day. Opening ceremonies start at 9am and camp closes at 4pm.

There is also the Tag-A-Long program for non-cub scout siblings that allow parents to volunteer for day camp. There are restrictions for this program so check the website for details. Additionally, if a parent volunteers for the week, their son can attend day camp for free.

The deposits due date has been extended to April 1st. Remaining camp payments are due by May 15th. We need volunteer coordinators and camp volunteers. These camps are great fun for scouts and volunteers alike.

6. Family Camping, July & August 2006

Weekend Family Camping is offered four weekends through the summer at Camp Carpenter in Manchester. These sessions begin Saturday morning and end Sunday morning. Cub Scouts may attend with their mother, father or entire family, including siblings. Three meals are provided in the camp's new dining hall. Most of the program area offered for resident campers are open for the family to enjoy. A spirit-filled campfire is held on Saturday evening.

Cost varies by age of participants ranging from a high of \$22 for 18 and older to \$10 for ages 3-5. (Age 2 and under are free) if paid by May 15th. If paid by May 15th, there is a maximum fee of \$80 per family. If paid after May 15th, the fee is \$5 more per person and there is no maximum fee limit.

7. Pack Hike, Mt. Major, Saturday, August 12th, 10am, rain date of Sunday the 13th, main lot.

Greetings! I will be coordinating the Cub Scouts' summer hike, which this year will be up Mount Major, just south of Lake Winnepesaukee, which features really breathtaking views, on a clear day, of the lakes and the mountains off in the distance. It is a fairly easy hike that I have done in the past with small children and found very enjoyable.

Plus, it is in the lakes region and not far from Weirs Beach and Ellacoya State park/beach (a nicely maintained beach right on the Big Lake), so there is plenty to do after we come down from the mountain. Also, there is quite a bit of low-bush blueberries along the way, however we will be a little past the season and this hike's trails are well traveled, so pickings will likely be slim.

The hike will be on Saturday, August 12th, with a rain date of Sunday the 13th. I am shooting for a 10am rally time in the main lot. The hike is not even 2 miles each way, (1 to 1.5 hours each way). We can lunch at the top, and expect to be back down the mountain by mid afternoon in plenty of time to find other things to do. Notably, Weirs beach houses one of the state's only 2 operating Drive-In Theatres; maybe if a few families wanted to hang around the Weirs area after the hike and see the sights, we could also work in a movie adventure.

I have listed a few interesting links below, or you can "Google" Mount Major yourself for more info. The trailheads are at the rear of the main lot, which is about 6 miles up route 11 from the Alton traffic circle. The best way is probably to go up 293N to 93N to exit 15E, Route 393E to the Epsom traffic circle, then take route 28 north up to the Alton Traffic circle, then take route 11 north from there towards Weirs Beach. The lot is on the left side of the road, expect about an hour and a half drive time.
